


EDUCATION



Alhamdulillah, with Allah's permission and tayseer, Qahwa has hit the ground running since we've opened in December 2021. Our main objective of bringing the youth back to the masjid and making the youth programming relevant and self-sustainable is coming to fruition by Allah's will and blessing! Despite initially operating in a limited capacity due to COVID and other limitations, we've far exceeded our initial financial projections and reinvigorated the youthful culture of ADAMS. We have grossed over \$85.5K in sales and sold over 24,000 items. We've employed over 15 part-time staff, and 1 full-time staff, most of which are youth from our community!


ADAMS YOUTH

Members who once felt disconnected from ADAMS are reaching out asking to get involved. Guests from other local masajid are attending our events and asking to volunteer and become part of ADAMS. Public speakers and Muslim influencers are reaching out and asking us to host events and activities. Several national masajid have reached out and asked for our consultancy in helping them build their own coffee shops and youth centers. Local Muslim businesses are reaching out regularly and soliciting Qahwa to offer their products and services. We are actively collaborating with other institutes on program development and outreach. The Qahwa Instagram account has almost 2,400 followers with millions of impressions, surpassing many of our other social media accounts that have been active for years! Allah has truly blessed this community and especially this effort, Alhamdulillah!

2021 Total Revenue - \$6,810,159 (Total Funds Collected in 2021)



ADAMS Ashburn Celebrated the opening ceremony of its permanent location at Suite 120 of 21740 Beaumeade Circle, on March 28, 2021. The Grand Opening event was attended by a large Muslim and interfaith communities of Loudoun and Fairfax counties, ADAMS leadership, state and county officials, and religious leaders from various interfaith groups.

ADAMS Ashburn was established in 2003 and moved to 21740 Beaumeade circle, suite 100-B, Ashburn, VA 20148 in May 2009. It was the first full-service branch of ADAMS and sharing space from Jewish Congregation BCRC.

Since its establishment Ashburn branch has been providing Education, Youth, Community, and Interfaith services to our community in addition to five daily, Jumah, and Ramadan prayers.

Children Education Program (CEP) Saturday School is currently serving more than 140 students under the leadership of Branch Management and Sr. Shahina Raja Principal for CEP.

The hard work and countless efforts of Ashburn Committee, led by Br. Syed Akhtar Alam, Co-Chair and member of Board of Trustees, was paid off when Loudoun county Board of Supervisors approved the special use permit for the new ADAMS Ashburn branch to build its own center on an approximately 10,000 square feet property, purchased and paid off \$1.25 million by the community. The new building will accommodate the growing Ashburn community. In addition to Beaumeade Circle location, the Ashburn branch provided three Jumah prayers for many years at a satellite location and served an additional six to seven hundred congregants.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and governmental restrictions, Ashburn still offered limited services to the community during the year 2021-22.

Saturday Children Education Program (CEP) has been operating both virtually and in person since the beginning of school year 2021-22

Syed Moktadir, and many other local officials and community leaders speaking at this historical event. ADAMS Leesburg had Friday prayers at two locations with 3 total prayers.

Every week more than 200 members attend prayers. ADAMS appointed a transition team and then a 20+ member Leesburg Branch Operations Committee

Allah says in Surah Al-'Imran, Ayah 103: "And hold firmly to the rope of Allah and do not be divided." In the spirit of this message from Allah, Muslim Community Center of Leesburg (MCCL), founded and led by Br. Abdul Basir Ghanizada, joined hands with the All Dulles Area Muslim Society (ADAMS) to become the official Leesburg Branch of ADAMS. It was officially announced at Eid al Adha 1442 prayers on Tuesday July 20, 2021.

The future looks bright for Leesburg, Al-Hamdulillah. We pray to Allah to make the construction easy and swift so we can continue to grow and expand the programming and services for the Leesburg Muslim community. Education

Approximately 66 CEP students are receiving Islamic education from the Virtual Sunday school; the classes are held from 10 am to 5 pm on Sundays.

ADAMS Gainesville kept its faith strong during the pandemic and continued its journey to fulfill ADAMS mission and vision by serving the community using all the available and possible channels.

Religious: ADAMS Gainesville took all necessary measures for the safety of community by strictly following CDC and ADAMS guidelines on all gatherings. During the first eight months of 2021, ADAMS Gainesville continued to hold outdoor Jumma prayers at Linton Hall School. We then moved back to Wyndham gardens in Manassas after the widespread availability of COVID vaccines and continued to use masks and followed social distancing.

We also prayed Taraweeh in person with masks and followed social distancing guidelines at Linton Hall School.

Islamic Education: ADAMS Gainesville knows the importance of Islamic education and we continued in providing virtual Sunday School classes to approximately 100 students. We moved back to Battle Field High School with wearing masks and followed social distancing during the second half of 2021.

Social Activities: During the pandemic, the community felt isolated so we arranged several virtual town halls and outdoor events. We also arranged several community potlucks with social distancing.

Masjid Construction: ADAMS Gainesville didn't let the pandemic slow down the efforts for building our Masjid. We continued working hard on building architecture and design of ADAMS Gainesville Masjid. During the pandemic, ADAMS Construction committee had been diligently working with various contractors (architectural group, wetlands management, civil engineering firms), Prince William County, and legal experts to complete all prerequisites for obtaining all required permits for starting actual construction.

Alhamdulillah, ADAMS Gainesville did break the ground in the summer of 2021 after getting the permit to hold that event.

Donations: We knew that community is going through hard times during the pandemic, so we held few virtual town hall meetings to provide Masjid construction and other important community updates. We also held virtual and physical fund-raising events in 2021.

ADAMS GAINESVILL

The ADAMS Sully Center consists of the Musallah (for religious services), the Sully Sunday School (CEP and YEP) and hosts the Adams Compassionate Healthcare Network Clinic. It also has some spaces to support youth activities and other community entertainment events. The following is a summary of the activities supported at the center for the year 2021.

Religious: Daily salah and weekly Jumaa started at the beginning of the year, as we began holding three daily prayers and by spring 2021 five daily prayers were held including 3 sessions of Jumaa prayers every Friday. Strict masking mandates were advocated and enforced. Donations towards masks were received from donors which helped with masking enforcement throughout the year. Following are additional details on religious activities provided to the Sully community and others.

- Jumaa prayers: we are currently managing six Jumaa prayers each Friday in two locations: Sully Center with four Jumaas and Home2Suites in South Riding with two Jumaas. NOTE: Sully South Riding Masjid is in the process of negotiation with the donor of the land.
- Sully Ramadan Prayers: we held two Taraweeh prayers simultaneously during Ramadan at Sully Center accommodating approximately 175-200 people and Home2Suites accommodating approximately 75-100 people Note: Sully has provided food, accommodation, and miscellaneous expenses of five Huffaz, who came from the State of Michigan to lead Ramadan Taraweeh at the two locations (Home2Suites South Riding and Sully Center Musallah).
- Sully Eid-ul-Fitr prayer and Sully Eid-ul-Adha prayer was held at Dulles Expo center with an approximate attendance of 8,000 people.

Islamic Education: The Sully Sunday school which went online for the 2020/21 session due to the pandemic and was brought back to physical attendance for the 2021/22 session. We hired additional staff (teachers) to support six classes for CEP and one class for YEP. The number of students in attendance surpassed 120. The adult education program continued with weekly online Quran Tajweed class on Wednesdays and Saturdays. Quran Halaqah taught by Imam Saeed was every Sunday after Fajr.

Social Activities: The COVID-19 pandemic impacted social events during 2021. With the vaccination successes towards the end of 2021, Sully was able to host a few social gatherings with masking requirements enforced.

ACHN Clinic: Sully Center also hosts the ACHN clinic which has been busy with vaccination efforts. The successes achieved with a significant number of our community members as well as others being vaccinated at the clinic. The clinic continues to support patients and vaccinations while Sully Center maintains the facility and related utility expenses. We are glad to be part of that effort to the community and others in need.

Our comprehensive services are made possible thanks to the dedication and time of our community health partners and volunteer network of over 80 medical volunteers which include 15 primary care physicians, 32 specialists, and 33 medical volunteers, assistants, and student trainees.

Our innovative healthcare model is available to all low-income and uninsured individuals who qualify regardless of race, religion, ethnic- 23, 2021 ity, or zip code.

Thanks to our partners, volunteers, and donors, we provide a wide range of patient services including primary and eye care, preventative screenings, blood work, imaging, prescriptions, and referrals. Our integrated approach also includes hot-spotting, telehealth services, care coordination, food and housing security evaluations, and preventative health education.

As a community health partner, ACHN helps train students obtaining a masters or medical degree. Our student volunteers have backgrounds in medicine, social work, and nursing from universities near the DMV area including UVA, GMU, ODU, and many more. For all patient cases, student volunteers are supervised by a licensed professional.


