ADAMS TAHFEEDH UL QURAN PROGRAM

PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS:

After the student completes the required assessments, teachers and staff will review the assessment results, recommendation letters, family support, behavior, abilities, motivation and overall focus level.

If the child is approved, the Tahfeedh ul Quran Program will send an acceptance letter by email to the family. If a child is approved, but a seat is not available at that time, the family will be updated frequently when a seat would be available so the family can plan grade level studies accordingly. Please note, that the child must continue to maintain good academic standing in Quran reading skills, maintain areas noted in the assessments and follow the specific instructions provided while waiting for a seat to open in the program. The child will be reassessed to ensure he/she is still eligible to enroll in the program.

The Tahfeedh ul Quran Program school year begins in September and ends in August. Classes typically begin the day after Labor Day and end in mid-August with holidays for Thanksgiving, Winter Break, Eid Celebrations, Memorial Day & Independence Day.

The Tahfeedh ul Quran Program consists of two tracks, Hifdh Preparation Track and Memorization Track. All new students are enrolled in the Hifdh Preparation Track. Upon successful completion of the Hifdh Preparation track, the student will be approved to transition to the Memorization track. In the Memorization Track, the student will be assigned a rigorous daily recitation workload consisting of approximately 30 to 40 pages of reviews, approximately 15 pages of recent juz and the new ayats from the current surah.

HIFDH PREPARATION TRACK:

All new students are placed in the Hifdh Preparation Class. This class is designed to provide an opportunity for the student to experience the quran memorization process and build a strong foundation for memorization success. It also provides parents an opportunity to get firsthand experience of what is expected from parents regarding time commitment and support on daily basis to help their child have a successful hifdh journey. Additionally, it will provide useful information for teachers/staff to see if the student is a good fit for the memorization track by closely monitoring academic abilities, efforts to study, overall motivation, behavior, stamina to sit for long hours, and focus level to concentrate on details related to tajweed and Quran learning.

Students in the hifdh track are prepared for rigorous memorization by receiving daily instructions to refine pronunciation of arabic letters, practice many pages of reading to build accuracy & fluency, and develop consistency in tajweed application. Gradually, students will be trained and will have stamina to recite with good quality half juz to all juz 30th in one sitting without losing focus, in sha'Allah.

The class consists of individualized time with the teacher, group learning and individual practice time. Students are required to read the meanings of the surahs & increase Quranic Vocabulary. In the hifdh track, the students will learn how to read accurately and complete at a minimum, the memorization of juz 30 & juz 29 with tajweed application.

Additionally, students will receive training daily to develop effective time management skills, improve focus levels and develop effective study habits in class and at home. They will learn to set short-term and long-term goals for memorization and reviewing.

Students will learn the value of the Quran, the purpose of memorizing the Quran, and the importance of learning and reciting the Quran with tajweed rules. Students learn manners of how to respect the Quran and respectful ways of reciting to teachers. Daily lessons will emphasize the importance of cleanliness, wudhu, praying regularly, morning duas, the 5 pillars of Islam, Hadith and Sunnah. Students learn the responsibilities of a hafidh/hafidha and positive ways to further develop their love & connection to Allah.

In the hifdh track, the students will learn the importance of being kind, respectful and helpful to everyone. They will receive training and are expected to be considerate to parents by giving them water and care, helping with house chores and being obedient. Additionally, they will be expected to be caretakers of the masjid and assigned to organize books, clean up the masjid, help elderly, and take care of plants around the masjid.

The student's daily performance in Quran and overall disposition will be monitored frequently, and parents will receive comprehensive daily reports and updates. If a child is not showing progress due to:

• frequent absences, tardies, lack of motivation, lack of efforts, lack of parent support, lack of involvement with child's homework, student/family not following directions and plans as set forth by teacher, adding new memorization without approval, un-satisfactory performance on tests or unable to bear the work-load to maintain and apply tajweed with reviews and daily work, the family will be informed and parent/teacher meetings will be held and specific changes/progress must be shown by student in order to continue in the program.

Students who are not eligible to continue in the program will be highly encouraged to enroll in evenings/weekend Quran Classes or consider memorization with independent online or in-person tutors at home at a pace that will be more suitable for the child.

Students who develop good skills and habits in the Hifdh Preparation Track will be transitioned to Memorization Track, in shaa Allah.
